Difficult Dialogues, Immigration: Is This Who We Are?

If you're wondering when the danger towards immigrants in this country is coming, It's already here, according to Kathleen Glynn who held a speech at Colorado Chautauqua's Community House, Thursday.

Kathleen Glynn currently works in the CU Boulder immigration clinic, as well as serving as a senior associate lawyer at Grob & Eirich, LLC, specializing in Immigrant Juvenile Status and the intersection of immigration law and adoption.

Glynn's speech was centered around the implications of current immigration enforcement on American identity and culture.

Much of the discussion involved the recent escalation of ICE raids throughout the U.S., specifically in how the recent raids had " little to no amount of legality to them" according to Glynn.

During the discussion, Glynn offered her expertise from her legal background to answer questions and concerns that related to immigration law and enforcement. The discussion involved many different conversations and input from crowd members, showing a great level of connection and interaction between community members and community experts.

After the discussion had ended, the crowd of community members conversed with one another, furthering the discussion even after the event had ended. One attendee named Violet Scott, a CU student majoring in history shared her thoughts on the discussion
